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CEEPUS



- "Central European Exchange Network for University Studies"
- 16 signatory countries of the CEEPUS III Agreement in Central and South-East Europe (but not Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Greece)
- CEEPUS IV Agreement in 2025:
- Austria still remains within CEEPUS, Ukraine and some other countries of East Europe (maybe Belarus) and the Caucasian region (Armenia, Georgia, Azerbaijan) may join the CEEPUS programme.
- It will partly keep virtual and hybrid mobilities as complementing the traditional physical way of academic exchanges, which will nevertheless remain the priority.

Name and goal of the network *Philosophy and Interdisciplinarity*



- First network within CEEPUS dedicated primarily to philosophy
- Fosters interdisciplinary research on a broad philosophical basis
- Investigates foundation, potentials and purposes of interdisciplinary research
- Connects institutions of Central and SE Europe
- Institutionalization of the existing international cooperation between departments and institutes for philosophy in C and SE Europe (*thèse en cotutelle*)
- Internationalization of education at the institutions of SE Europe

Internationalization of education in SE Europe



- 1. More circulation of foreign students and teachers
- 2. More opportunities for student and teacher mobilities when combining Erasmus+ with CEEPUS
- 3. Introduction of new courses in English/German/French

Summer Schools



First summer school: "The Role of Philosophy in Interdisciplinary Research and the Encounter of European Societies"

July 12-18, 2021, University of Graz

- 12 lecturing teachers (Czech Republic 1, Austria 4, Poland 2, Croatia 2, Serbia 3; 6 of them were local network coordinators; cancellations from Romania, Slovenia, Bulgaria, B&H)
- 31 (BA/MA/PhD) foreign students (Czech Republic 1, Slovakia 5, Poland 4+6, Croatia 5+2, Serbia 4+4)
- Lectures and discussions, seminars, round tables (relaxed, interactive, and improvised when needed; *café philosophique* in leisure time)
- Extra funding (2000 euros) for travel costs from the project *Dimensionen der Europäisierung* of the University of Graz.

Summer Schools



Second summer school: "Interdisciplinarity within Philosophy, Philosophy behind Interdisciplinarity"

July 10-16, 2023, <u>Center for Interdisciplinary Research</u>, Josip Juraj Strossmayer University of **Osijek**

- 17 lecturing teachers (Germany 1, Czech Republic 3, Austria 1, Poland 1, Romania 1, Slovenia 2, Croatia 4, Serbia 4; 10 of them were local network coordinators)
- 30 (BA/MA/PhD) foreign students (Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, Romania, Slovenia, Serbia, Bulgaria) and ca. 10 Croatian students (from Osijek, Split and Zagreb)
- Lectures and discussions, seminars, round tables (relaxed, interactive, and improvised when needed)
- Extra organizational and financial support for travel and accommodation from various Croatian institutional sources.

Summer Schools



Future summer schools

- Frequency: every 2 years
- Location of the next summer school (July 2025): Faculty of Humanities, Prague
- Topics of summer schools in the future: either the general topic(s) of the network or some special topic within interdisciplinary fields connected to philosophy

Interdisciplinarity of research fields in the network



1) studies in the field of history of philosophy in comparison with history of science, art and religion

2) ethics and bioethics in close connection to biomedical and biotechnical sciences

3) philosophy of education and **pedagogy** and **psychology** (comprising also some new fields like **philosophy for children**)

4) practical philosophy (social and political philosophy) and **sociology** and **political science**

- 5) investigations into philosophy of language and logic
- 6) the relationship of **cognitive science** and philosophy

7) philosophy of art in context of **cultural studies** and in comparison to **sociology and anthropology of art**.

Joint programs



- In principle joint BA, MA or PhD studies (at least thèse en cotutelle)
- Since 2018/2019 other, less formalized and defined forms of joint programs are also possible and valuated:
- Joint courses (courses held together at 2 or more institutions within the network and courses made up of guest lecturers):

E.g. WW 2018/2019 professors Igor Mikecin and Lj. F. Ježić (Zagreb) and Una Popović (Novi Sad) at Charles University, Department of German and French Philosophy created and held a new course *Die Rolle der Sprache in Philosophie, Kunst und Religion.*

Possible mobilities within CEEPUS



- Student (semestral) mobility
- Short-term student mobility
- Teacher mobility
- Short excursion (only students, primarily for summer schools)
